Reminder for Safford Residents

Residents living in the Safford city limits are allowed one free truck load of residential trash to the Safford Landfill once per month. Bring your City of Safford Utility Bill showing City of Safford trash service and driver's license (address on driver's license must match address on utility bill). All loads must be secured to avoid a tarp fee.

Ready to Become a Safford Resident?

In May 2019, Safford City Council passed a Resolution effective July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020 waiving Building Permit fees, and reimbursing Water Capacity fees and Water Meter fees for new single family residential or duplex homes in Safford.

Qualifications for New Home Construction:

- Work authorized by that building permit shall commence within ninety (90) days after permit issuance. Required inspections shall occur before the expiration of each ninety (90) day time period. If the work authorized by that building permit is not commenced or has been suspended for a period exceeding 90 days, the building permit will be revoked.
- Home must be completed within one year of the permit being issued.
- Home must be built within the city or newly annexed areas of the city.
- All public infrastructure to service the new home must be in place or be built in conjunction with the home.
