A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAFFORD, GRAHAM COUNTY, ARIZONA ADOPTING AND APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAFFORD (CITY) AND THE SAFFORD UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT (DISTRICT) FOR USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES

WHEREAS, the District, pursuant to Arizona law, operates and maintains buildings and recreational facilities within the City;

WHEREAS, the City desires to use, and to enable its residents to use, certain District buildings and recreational facilities;

WHEREAS, the District desires to make certain buildings and recreational facilities available for use by the City and its residents, in accordance with the terms of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the District is empowered, pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 11-1951, et seq., 15-342.13 and 15-364 to enter into intergovernmental agreements for the use of recreational facilities in conjunction with other governmental agencies, and the City is empowered to enter such agreements pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 11-951, et seq. and 15-364.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Safford, Graham County, Arizona that the Intergovernmental Agreement for Use of School Facilities between the City of Safford and the Safford Unified School District, all as attached and incorporated herein, is hereby adopted, and approved; and further, the Mayor is executing the agreement on behalf of the City.




